## Minimum speeds

It seems their is some discussion concerning minimum speeds:

#### Article 824 Categories of Endurance Rides

has been changed by the FEI Bureau at its meeting held in Moscow on 6 – 7 November 2002 and came into force on 1 January 2003. In this article the compulsory minimum (and maximum) speeds for 1 to 4 star rides have been cancelled (see Bulletin FEI 6/2002). Discussions took place with the following question: Does this mean that an organiser is not allowed to fix an overall minimum speed for a ride?

### Article 807 Speeds and Distances


The distance of the phases shall be determined by the OC and should be published in the schedule to allow competitors to establish their pace to compete against the clock (also refer to Art. 800.4). However if the weather conditions become such that there is a danger to the welfare of the horse the President of the Ground Jury in consultation with the TD and President of the Veterinary Commission may reduce the minimum speed or change the total distance of the ride or change the length of the loops or change the parameters such as holding times and time to present. In this case the riders and or the Chef d'Equipes must be immediately informed.


#### SOME STATISTICS ON THE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS 1986 – 2002

#### •NUMBER OF STARTERS AT WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS




#### ENDURANCE INTERCONTINENTAL
