Open European Endurance Championship 2003, Punchestown, IRL: Timetable News

Since the last newsletter has been published the timetable of the Open European Endurance Championship has been changed: Sunday 21st September:

05.00 Start of the Open European Endurance Championship (instead of 04.00)

The further programme of Sunday 21st September stays the same:

- 16.30 expected finish of the race
- 17.00 Prize giving ceremony
- Start at 05.00, expected finish at 16.30, prize giving at 17.00....

With an overall holding time of approximately 2 hours 30 minutes and approximately 30 minutes to present the horse for the final control and change in "prize giving dress" – this leaves us at 9.00 hours possible riding time. If you want to participate (on the podium or as spectator) at the prize giving ceremony you will have to finish the race in 17.8 km/ h...

Vet-Gate Procedure – two scenarios and possible outcomes

First Scenario:

The horse is presented in the vet-gate. It is stiff, slightly lame. The Vet asks for a re-trot in front of three Vets and a member of the Ground Jury. Vote 2 - 1 for lameness. The horse is eliminated.

Possible outcomes:

- The rider/ grooms/ owner are disappointed. Heartbreaking atmosphere. The horse is cared for but not cheered.
- The rider/ grooms/ owner are angry. Lots of discussion. The horse stands a little bit forgotten in the vet-gate area.
- The rider/ grooms/ owner are very angry. Lots of discussion with officials and vets. Nobody really looks after the horse for a long time.

Second Scenario:

The horse is presented in the vet-gate. It is stiff, slightly lame. The Vet asks for a recheck ten minutes before the next possible departure. Rider/ grooms/ owner care very much for the horse during the compulsory halt. The horse is fed, massaged, walked, controlled etc.

Possible outcomes:

- The horse passes the re-check because the stiffness disappeared due to the rest time and the care of rider/ grooms/ owner.
- The horse is eliminated at the re-check because it is really lame.

The rider/ grooms/ owner are probably still disappointed or angry or very angry and do perhaps not care for the horse as they should. But at least the horse was carefully managed during half an hour...
